- 2 All you need to do is pay three visits to Tetbury library between 10 July and 4 September and borrow at least two books each time. That's all it takes! Books can be fiction, non-fiction, graphic novels, or audio books, whatever you like. We do suggest you actually read the books, but it's not compulsory! You'll be making a difference and changing the world...
- 3 Along with helping the library and the WWF, by taking part in the Summer Reading Challenge which this year has the theme "Wild World Heroes."
 

You'll receive a poster and a set of stickers on your first visit, more stickers and a bookmark on your second visit and yet more stickers - plus a medal and a certificate of completion - on your last visit. There will also be nature-themed craft activities for you to do at home and the library are hoping to run some events - look out for posters at the library and on Facebook, on the Gloucestershire Libraries page.

- 4 You can also join in online at <https://summerreadingchallenge.org.uk> where you can, after creating your profile, play games, enter competitions, review the books you've read, find new books to read with the Book Finder and earn badges.
 

Another way to be a hero, especially for grownups, is by giving something back to the library. There are opportunities for volunteers to help with the Summer Reading Challenge during the holidays. There is also an opportunity for a permanent volunteer on Tuesday afternoons.
