Are They Insulting Our Intelligence?	

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...and If they are - is it because we've just not held them to account before?

- 1 With BoJo as good as gone - we have had a raft of *Would-Bees*, lining up frantically to take his place. In fact, there were - at the start - no fewer than twelve of them - all thinking they possess the right stuff to be the next PM.

Nine of them were still in the cabinet at the point of BoJo's resignation and, amazingly, 2 of them had only been promoted to that high office just hours before. I hope you see the problem with all this. Rats know when it's time to leave a sinking ship - but these MPs don't!

- 3 All these current cabinet ministers - and those few recently put in place to fill the gaping holes in the ship's sides - should really have abandoned some time ago - many would say. The fact that they have stayed means they are at one with BoJo and all that he stood for. Some will have argued that it was their duty to stay in post to support the government - led as it was by a person who appears at every turn to make it his duty to distort the truth whatever that might be.
- 4 But a couple of high-profiled ministers did jump and only at the last minute - to be followed by no fewer than 60 other government ministers and officials

One of Mr Johnson's staunchest allies, Culture Secretary Nadine Dorries, was furious. [*she wasn't one of those jumping ship*].

"I was quite stunned that there were people who thought that removing the prime minister who's won the biggest majority that we've had since Margaret Thatcher in less than three years - was acceptable]" she says.

"The anti-democratic nature of what they were doing was enough to alarm me. For me it was a coup."

- 5 But surely, the alarming thing is, that this MP sees nothing wrong in the core principle. Even if BoJo was responsible for delivering the biggest majority for the Tory party - since the Thatcher era - it does not mean you just career on blindly. Captain Smith careered on blindly with the Titanic – steaming full-ahead through an ice field. If anyone thought that was a good idea – and I refer to the bridge crew – then they too – like Smith - were deluded.

Every half-intelligent or semi-wise sea captain sets sail believing that a course adjustment or correction might be required at some point. And if the crew stay quiet knowing such is needed, then they have no place being part of that crew and should be shown the *plank!*

Ms Dorries was part of the crew – like all the others – but she wasn't shown the plank. She and the others weren't shown the plank because the PM needed a passive crew to dictate to. It seems the PM operated as a dictator like so many other politicians around the world.

- 6 Here I will inject a point of principle to consider. Supporting the captain is a perfect idea and concept – except when it's not. The captain however should be supported by a competent crew. The role of any captain is to use his crew by having them provide their considered judgement based upon their expertise. It is after the crew have provided their judgement that the captain makes a decision. Whilst the captain has overall responsibility – how a captain reaches any decision might vary depending on the circumstances.

In any scenario, the crew should give counsel to the captain and be free to do so. Whether that happened in the Thatcher era is debatable. Whether it has happened in any era of politics is also debatable! So, one question which might be tabled is - just how dictatorial have our own previous PMs been?

- 7 What I presume many would say is this. Those who have stayed to support BoJo and his government could be called spineless and without an ounce of honour, or integrity between them all. What has happened over the last two years - if not far longer - is surely clear enough for the most unenlightened voter. The final analysis of this politician will NOT make for good reading if you happen to be - still - a BoJo supporter - now declared a NoJo.

Rishi Sunak

Former Chancellor of the Exchequer - resigning just days ago
Has allowed tumultuous spending on all kinds of bad projects

Liz Truss

Foreign Secretary
Is happy to lead this country to war with Russia

Sajid Javid - since withdrawn - **Out stage 1** - failed to secure 20 votes

Former Health Secretary - resigning just days ago
Picked up where Matt Hancock left off - failing to tell the truth

Rehman Chishti - since withdrawn - **Out stage 1** failed to secure 20 votes

Recently promoted from MP to Foreign Office Minister

Nadhim Zahawi

New Chancellor of the Exchequer - promoted just days ago
Out stage 2 - Failed to get 30 votes

Jeremy Hunt - **Out stage 2** - Failed to win 30 votes

Member of Parliament - Ex-cabinet Health Minister
He was in place when the NHS ran [Cygnus](#). He learnt nothing useful.

Suella Braverman

Attorney General - **Out stage 3** - Least number of votes

Penny Mordaunt

Minister of State - **Now out leaving the two remaining contenders**
Believes pregnant women should be branded pregnant persons

Tom Tugendhat

Member of Parliament - without specific role

Priti Patel - **Withdraws stage 1**

Home Secretary
Where do we begin?

Grant Shapps - since withdrawn - **Out stage 1** - Failed to secure 20 votes

Transport Secretary
Would follow NoJo to the grave - irrespective

Kemi Badenoch - **Out leaving the last three contenders**

Former levelling up minister - resigning just days ago

I was interested - but not surprised - to see that another high-profiled and senior MP had decided NOT to enter the contest. I refer to Sir Graham Brady - the chairman of the 1922 Committee. He's the one - among other things he does - who collects the letters from Conservative MPs calling for a No-Confidence vote in the PMs - which we've had a spate of now. The latest vote was just a few weeks ago - and the result was:

211 FOR and 148 AGAINST - keeping the PM BoJo in place -
with a **margin of just 63 votes** [meaning ONLY 58% supported him].

So, PM BoJo survived the vote - vowed to continue - and did.

Sir Graham though is an interesting study and I will return to him below. He is quite a secretive MP in some respects and perhaps a little too secretive!

Before doing so – one further mention of him.

- 9 The BBC entertainment show, *The Apprentice*, led by Lord Sugar - a business entrepreneur - gives an interesting window on how the new PM might be chosen. The show's format has provided in the past an engaging in-depth view of the character, personality and, above all, the ability of each candidate – seeking to get chosen to be Lord Sugar's business partner. It is an idea and format which Sir Graham might have thought about utilising in this current endeavour.

The TV debates – where the last remaining candidates go head2head with each other - almost game show in nature – are as close as they'll get to Lord Sugar's *Apprentice* format!

The truth though – if such an *Apprentice* idea were adopted – is that there is more than a high probability that - one by one - all the MPs would be fired. Perhaps we should look back at the past contestants of the show, where I 'm sure we could find people with more ability – not to mention imagination.

But moving on...

- 10 What we have now all begun to be fed with by these contestants, is a list of the things these *Would-Bees* would do for us. And top of the list is tax cuts.

Well, who among us – at a personal level - would not be happy to see these? How is it though that these *Would-Bees* have sufficient grasp on the economy right now – given all the weaknesses and complexities which are clearly present – to make such brash promises to their fellow voting MPs?

At this stage, it is their fellow voting MPs they are appealing to – since the wider country doesn't have – and will not have – a say in who becomes the next PM. Many of their fellow MPs – with already high taxable income – will be delighted at the prospect of their new captain reducing their personal tax liability – and who could blame them for that?

But is this behaviour total incompetence at best – or madness at worst? If new management get to take-over a battered ship, surely the first job of a captain is to do a complete and thorough survey of that ship. Of course it is!

For a *Would-Bee* to declare – surprising us all - that nothing will be changed until that survey has been concluded, would surely be exactly the right approach. It is an approach however that you will not – I think – hear from any of these *Would-bees*. They are truly as weak as each other and I fear the country will again suffer at the hands of the next dictator.

- 11 Speaking of dictators – I mentioned Sir Graham Brady MP earlier.

What an insight this MP has provided for us - and an insight which it would be folly to ignore.

The MP was present at a meeting in the late summer of 2021 which took place at No1 Birdcage Walk in Westminster. Present at the meeting were more than 15 extremely high-ranking doctors and scientists and other specialists in their own fields. The purpose of the meeting - in part at least - was to convey to Sir Graham some extremely important facts about the pandemic and related medical issues. Sir Graham listened for 2hrs to the evidence and testimony provided by the *profiled* attendees. Their heavily detailed submissions included some damning information about the effects of the untested vaccines being administered to the population on the government's advice.

Sir Graham admitted that there was nothing he could do to stop the roll out of the vaccine despite what he was told at the meeting and what he already knew.

One initial point to mention is this. Although it is not detailed in the account of the meeting linked to below - one of the specialist attendees had said, in a previous account of the same meeting, this. Sir Graham had insisted that the meeting should be conducted on the basis of [Chatham House Rules](#).

You can make up your own mind about the consequence of that insistence, in the context of this particular meeting. Why would Sir Graham wish to place a cloak of secrecy over the proceedings - particularly given the nature of the meeting? I would say though, that all those present - other than Sir Graham - were believed to be very happy for Chatham House Rules NOT to apply - meaning each of them were more than OK with their quotes being publicly attributable to them. How refreshing!

Sir Graham - after 2hrs - left the meeting with a dossier of information about the pandemic - the related medical issues - and the reactions to it. In effect, the government had been briefed at senior level by some of the brightest brains in Britain, qualified and positioned to comment in detail.

What happened after?

Nothing!

And that dear reader should tell us something very important indeed.

I will leave you to make up your own mind as to how that lack of government reaction should be interpreted.

One of the doctors present and providing testimony to the government, wrote to PM BoJo – and his Health Minister Matt Hancock - in the early winter of 2021. The doctor's judgement was laid out for PM BoJo - and his Health Minister - in a video communication.

The content could not have been more important and was in effect a personal call to PM BoJo to save lives - based on significant, compelling and accumulated evidence relative to a medical alternative to the vaccination strategy.

And if there is no change to be had from a new PM – another question arises. What are the People to do about that?

Oh, and as for the question about insulting our intelligence.

It certainly looks like it to me!

So, what I wonder is to be done?

Do we all roll our eyes like before and forget?

Or do we think hard about the alternatives we might pursue?

I do confess to liking the latter idea.
