BBC One Rule 4U And A Tiny One 4Me

What we all need is a completely New start - based on New World Thinking

- How many times have each of us heard the above title or version of it "It's one rule for us and another one for them."

 More times I fancy that we would wish to count.
- The thing is apart from the almost fun nature of the line there is a very real element of truth about it. Last week the Party-gate stories came to a head centred on No 10 and other gov't offices with the MET police issuing token fines to the accused found guilty. No fines issued for the crime of lying -yet!

At the time PM Johnson was using all the tricks we have seen him play to deflect the focus and confuse the picture. Do you recall him putting in place the Cabinet Secretary, Simon Case, to investigate the goings on in his house? Well, <u>Simon quickly resigned</u> from that charge, thinking it was better to do so in view of the fact that he too had been organising parties in his own office.

Step up Sue Gray to take his place, who was then handed the poisoned chalice to complete the job. Oh dear, this was not going to end well, as it seemed Sue appeared to have integrity and would report things as they really were. And before she could report things as they really were, PM Johnson took back the chalice and gave it to the MET police.

Rishi Sunak at the time was eyeing his chances for moving next door on the basis the PM was about to have his backside bitten by all the vipers who do not have him on their own good time party lists!

How very clever to involve the MET, I thought at the time. This was not going to end with BoJo and his fellow party goers against the firing squad wall – at least not yet. If the MET were going to emerge from this pincer move, then they would surely have to come out with something – something like a slap on the wrist – and perhaps no more than that.

And just that they managed.

Although it is still to be made clear how many fines have been issued by the MET – and who to exactly – we already know enough to determine this is a complete farce.

But yesterday, BoJo got winged by some friendly fire, shot from the same side of the house. The MP started kindly, then said, he – the PM – was not worthy of holding the high office he did. That came from fellow Tory member, Mark Harper, who delivered what should amount to being a stinging blow. But these things rarely amount to such, as we all know. BoJo in response to Mark, said he regretted the situation but – hey, let's now sweep all this under the carpet shall we – forget it in other words – because we have other important work to get on with. And more cover to find, I would judge – since this topic is not going to blow over quickly, if at all.

Opposition leader Sir Keir Starmer in PM questions on <u>wed08dec21 afternoon</u> spoke of this:

Whilst these two-dozen people were letting their hair down at the No10 party, there were people in hospital dying. The mother of one woman he cited, was dying when she herself couldn't be allowed in to be with her - due to the very restrictions which Prime Minister Boris Johnson had put in place.

Starmer went on to say, that people responsible for organising and attending Christmas parties at the very same time as the No10 party was happening last year, were – as he spoke – were in court in London to receive their penalties for doing so.

Starmer asked the PM if the people concerned would be similarly treated? Interestingly, PM BoJo said yes. Strangely – or rather not so strangely – he also said that he didn't know what had happened that night in his own house and has asked the cabinet secretary to investigate. [That was **Simon Case**].

It sounds as though PM BoJo wasn't in attendance, or - if he was - perhaps he was unaware of what was happening around him as he was slightly sloshed in a corner somewhere.

6 I'm grateful to the supposedly honourable MP for raising these issues – since I have a similar issue to raise with the PM myself.

Let's look at the case of minister <u>Brandon Lewis MP</u> and <u>Jason Elworthy</u>. Brandon Lewis – no doubt courting favour with his boss – attempts to play down the seriousness of PM BoJo getting collared by the law and shown up for it. Brandon equates the penalty meted on PM BoJo to a light traffic offence. He is effectively saying, many have had them – so what's the big deal?

He might have used the analogy of a parking ticket – but he made it sound worse by upping the crime to a speeding offence. Calculated I'd say! And the penalty?

Well, it amounted to a token £50.

We will all have to see where this ends for PM BoJo, but I am given to wonder if that end might be any different if the token fine hadn't been £50. Let's wonder what might have happened if the fine was, say £12,000.

Jason Elworthy, was clearly as afraid of the talked about virus as PM BoJo and his mates were. It was safe for the PM to have parties – numerous parties – and Jason thought exactly the same. As covered by The Guardian – at the time of his party, with 500 of his mates present, Jason said,

"Ascot racecourse was preparing to welcome thousands of racegoers, and football crowds would soon be gathering to watch the Euros. "No one cared. Everyone was mixing," he says. "I'm not going to have people govern me when firstly they don't even abide by their own governance, and secondly that governance is flawed". Elworthy, who has had Covid twice, agrees there was a "limited necessity" for restrictions to stop it spreading, but is suspicious of the science".

Jason has made some very good points here.

But as he says elsewhere, people were suffering mentally and needed to get out and socialise. Many as we know have committed suicide due to the effects which isolation has had on some people. Jason was attempting to put something back in the lives of people – some of whom were literally at a breaking point.

So, this guy Jason gets a £12,000 fine and the PM gets a slapped wrist. This is enough – in fact it is far more than enough. It is time for a deep look at how government happens and who does the governing.
