Saudia Arabia are not shy when it comes to Mega building projects. The country also has a knack and passion for building wonderfully attractive structures that do not fail to amaze. But this latest project is quite different to anything that has been tabled before – anywhere.

For those who have not seen the videos on The Line yet, this is a brief outline.
 It is 500m high – with approx 150 floor levels
 It is 200m wide – from one side to the other
